## PASTOR ISSUES STATEMENT: Not everyone has wanted to celebrate Pride month

All around the country throughout June big commercial concerns, including major retailers, promoted Pride month. In my local town the main shopping Mall is called the Eden Centre. Along one of the thoroughfares of the Mall there was a specially erected photo station. It had steps up to a platform to stand on, along with rainbow-coloured surroundings, to enable shoppers to take selfies. The construction carried the words 'Pride 2023' and the hashtag #Edenjoy. The Eden Centre management have thereby assumed that shoppers were joyful about the very concept of a Pride month and, by doing so, they also demonstrated to the world their impeccably woke credentials.

In the local Tesco supermarket shoppers were greeted by a large Pride flag and a post which told us - 'Standing Proud Together...We stand together and make everyone feel welcome, every day'. This was a somewhat inaccurate statement, because Tesco executives obviously do not have any concern about the sensitivities of their customers who are Christians and who believe the Bible's plain teaching that homosexuality is sinful.

At a nearby retail park, shoppers at M&S had to walk by a noticeboard which announced - 'We'll double your donation to celebrate Pride', the reference being to an LGBT charity. The presumption behind this notice was that the customers at M&S, being decent upright citizens will, of course, wish to celebrate Pride. This presumption, however, is totally dismissive of those who adhere to a Christian worldview.

At my local Waitrose store there was a sign by the entrance declaring -'Proud to be ourselves – celebrating Pride together'. This highly trendy rejoicing in being 'inclusive' is, however, strangely exclusive of those who choose not to follow the new national religion of promoting all things LGBT. May I courteously ask the John Lewis Partnership - what about those customers who are Christians and who want to 'be themselves'

without having to endure the virtue-signalling of supermarkets intent on rubbishing Biblical morality?

Many will doubtless claim that these comments are 'homophobic', but the concept of homophobia has simply been invented to smear anyone who dares to



disagree with the LGBT agenda. It is a device to shut down civilised debate and to silence all opposition. However, it is the duty of a Christian Minister to point out the seriousness of sin – and it is in fact an act of love to one's neighbour to do so.

The endless propaganda by Government, big business and the media in promoting the LGBT cause is also encouraging many people to reject the Christian faith in their desire to be fashionable. The situation is made worse by many compromised churches which are willing to abandon the Bible's authority in order to swim with the tide.

What the executives at Waitrose, M&S and Tesco and various other major commercial concerns are publicly saying in their endorsement of Pride is quite simply this: The Bible is wrong and we, in our 21<sup>st</sup> century enlightenment, know better than God.

So this is where we are now in modern Britain: one of big business's most desired marketing techniques is to publicly trash the Word of God and effectively to tell Christians that they are bigoted people, because they believe in keeping the commandments of God.

### "Those that walk in pride He is able to abase."

Daniel 4:37

Amongst all the evils which lie naked and open before the eyes of Him with whom we have to do, pride seems especially to incur His holy abhorrence; and the outward manifestations of it have perhaps drawn down as much as, or more than, any other sin His marked thunderbolts. Pride cost Sennacherib his army and Herod his life; pride opened the earth to Korah, Dathan and Abiram and hung up Absalom in the boughs of an oak; pride filled the breast of Saul with murderous hatred against David and tore ten tribes at one stroke from the hand of Rehoboam. Pride drove Nebuchadnezzar from the society of his fellow men and made him eat grass as oxen - his body to be wet with the dew of Heaven, till his hairs were grown as eagles' feathers and his nails like birds' claws; and as it has cut off the wicked from the earth and left them neither son nor nephew, root nor branch, so it has made sad havoc even among the family of God.

Pride shut Aaron out of the promised land and made Miriam a leper white as snow; pride, working in the heart of David, brought a pestilence which cut off seventy thousand men; pride carried captive to Babylon Hezekiah's treasure and descendants – and cast Jonah into the whale's belly and, in his feelings, into the very belly of Hell. It is the only source of contention; the certain forerunner of a fall; the instigator of persecution; a gin for the feet; a chain to compass the whole body; the main element of deceitfulness and the grave of all uprightness.

The very opposite to charity, pride suffereth not long - and is never kind; she envieth always and ever vaunteth herself; is continually puffed up, always behaveth herself unseemly, ever seeketh her own, is easily provoked, perpetually thinketh evil, rejoiceth in iniquity, but rejoiceth not in the truth; beareth nothing, believeth nothing (good in a brother), hopeth nothing, endureth nothing. Ever restless and ever miserable, tormenting herself and tormenting others, the bane of churches, the fomenter of strife and the extinguisher of love – may it be our wisdom to see, our grace to abhor and our victory to overcome her – and may the experience of that verse in Hart's hymn be ours:

> "Thy garden is the place Where pride can not intrude; For should it dare to enter there, 'Twould soon be drown'd in blood."




## **UNRESTRAINED MAN**

"And the LORD said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do. Go to, let us go down, and there confound their language, that they may not understand one another's speech. So the LORD scattered them abroad from thence upon the face of all the earth: and they left off to build the city" (Genesis 11:6-8).

Man was never prepared to remain within the territory assigned him by the Lord; but like a recalcitrant animal, he has stalked up and down the boundary line looking for a means to escape the limitations that the Lord has placed upon him (for his own good and safety) and enter upon territories forbidden of God.

In the text, we are reminded of the occasion, just after the flood, when sinful man manifests his failure to learn anything from the display of judgment against sin which wiped out all of humanity, save the eight members of Noah's family.



The will of God for the family of Noah and their descendants is set forth in God's command to Noah after the flood waters had completely dissipated from the earth. "And God spake unto Noah, saying, Go forth of the ark, thou, and thy wife, and thy sons, and they sons' wives with thee. Bring forth with thee every living thing that is with thee, of all flesh, both of fowl, and of cattle, and of every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth; that they may breed abundantly in the earth, and be fruitful, and multiply upon the earth. And Noah went forth, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him" (Gen. 8:15-18).

The earth was to be replenished with a new race of humans and animals, springing from those borne to safety in the ark; but, as our text shows, post-diluvian man was as stubbornly opposed to doing God's will as was ante-diluvian man!

Rather than spreading across the lands of the new earth they said: "Go to, let us make brick, and burn them throughly. And they had brick for stone, and slime had they for morter. And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto Heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth" (Gen. 11:3-4).

This was not just a defying of God's command to spread abroad and re-populate the earth; it was also a defying of God in that they were determined to abandon the spiritual and religious commands of God and institute a new, a false and idolatrous system of worship.

The reference to "a tower, whose top may reach unto Heaven" was not a building of extreme height, but rather a building in which would be provided, in their estimation, a way to reach Heaven, an alternative to God's way of salvation. The response of God is but another act, subsequent to His flooding of the whole earth, to curb and curtail the obstinate rebellion of man who, under the devil's urgings, as was seen in the case of Adam and Eve, wanted to wrestle free of God's rule.

The words of the rejectors of Christ, set forth in Christ's parable – "We will not have this Man to reign over us" (Luke 19:14) – are but a sinful chant that man has repeated throughout the ages and the Tower of Babel was but one of the many locations where it was sung!

What God says of man in our text was true back then and is true still today. "Nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do." Man will stop at nothing in his determination to defy God and go beyond the limits God has set for him. He will not abide within the terms of God's Law. He will not abide within the boundaries of moral and social behaviour that God has ordained: but rather man, "professing themselves to be wise, they became fools, and changed the glory of the uncorruptible God into an image made like to corruptible man, and to birds, and fourfooted beasts, and creeping things. Wherefore God also gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts, to dishonour their own bodies between themselves: who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen. For this cause God gave them up unto vile affections: for even their women did change the natural use into that which is against nature: and likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly, and receiving in themselves that recompense of their error which was meet" (Rom. 1:23-27).

It is to be noted that religious apostasy is followed by moral depravity and a sinking down into abominable practices which, in turn, has brought upon those engaged in such, a "recompence of their error which was meet." One has only to think of the plague of 'AIDS' and the mental problems that have reportedly afflicted those who follow the sodomite lifestyle.

### PATRIOTISM

Political hypocrisy hath made the laudable name of patriotism almost suspicious; but he that is sincere in the best things and walks as in the sight of God will, of all men, be faithful in lower matters and carry a sterling integrity from religion into every duty of social life. On the other hand, he that regards not God, nor yet other men but as they are convenient to himself, may very justly be suspected in his fidelity to his country. Profit and vain glory, indeed, will carry some men very far, as they have done; but strip a worldly man of these and where are his motives for promoting the national welfare?

The Christian is not a mere showy patriot, for lucre or for fame; but he is, what none but a Christian can be, a patriot in spirit and in truth, pouring out his secret and earnest prayers before God for the true prosperity of the land. The world, indeed, hath a low opinion of this artillery of Heaven; but one who is wiser than the world hath told us that the effectual, fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. And if one such person, like an Elias, can be instrumental in drawing down public blessings, what may not be hoped for from the prayers of legions of Christians throughout the nation? We may read what the prayers of such men have done in Hebrews 11: 33,34.

The Christian patriot will rejoice in all the good done to his country, though other hands rather than his have been employed in the doing of it. That man deserves not the name of a patriot to whom the peace,



honour and prosperity of his country are valuable only as they may contribute to his own.

As the Christian's patriotism is founded upon the pure principles of religion, he is more desirous of his country's prosperity in true worth and virtue than in mere power and riches, which are often the dangerous fuel of luxury and pride both to States and individuals. He is no enemy to commerce, for a thousand reasons, but an utter enemy to commercial vices, for reasons infinite and eternal.

In wishing for his country all kinds of temporal blessings, he cannot forget to ask before God for a greater abundance of spiritual mercies. His heart's desire is, that the Gospel and religion of Jesus Christ, happily countenanced and established by the laws, may forever flourish through the land in all its genuine power and purity. Though he is not - and cannot be - an enemy to any man - yet he is a well-principled adversary to all wicked and blasphemous errors and opinions and to all profligacies of heart and life which flow from them and which have over -run the country with guilt and shame.

The Christian carries religion into his patriotism, but not his patriotism into his religion. The things of God are too holy and sacred with him, either to be mixed with or truckle to the little, low politics of men. He is the citizen of a better country and a pilgrim in all others, though a peculiar friend to that in which he was born.

As he can say with Samuel, God forbid that I should sin against the Lord, in ceasing to pray for this nation, so he would act upon all occasions - as Samuel did - and endeavour to promote the welfare of his country by being a good countryman. He will contribute fairly and cheerfully to her burdens, live in all Godly quietness and honesty among his people and pray faithfully and earnestly for the whole public weal as a Christian. Were all the subjects such patriots, the nation, with God's blessing, would have but small reason to live in fear of the most mighty and numerous enemies.

# **IS CHRIST YOUR LORD?**

We do not ask: Is Christ your "Saviour?" - but is He, really and truly, your Lord? If He is not your Lord, then He is most certainly not your "Saviour." Those who have not received Christ Jesus as their "Lord" and yet suppose Him to be their "Saviour" are deluded and their hope rests on a foundation of sand. Multitudes are deceived on this vital point and, therefore, if you value your soul, we implore you to give a most careful reading to this short article.

When we ask, is Christ your Lord? we do not inquire - do you believe in the Godhead of Jesus of Nazareth? The demons do that (Matt. 8:28-29) and yet perish notwithstanding! You may be firmly convinced of the Deity of Christ and yet be in your sins. You may speak of Him with the utmost reverence, accord Him His Divine titles in your prayers - and yet be unsaved. You may abominate those who traduce His person and deny His Divinity and yet have no spiritual love for Him at all.

When we ask - Is Christ your Lord? - we mean, does He in very deed occupy the throne of your heart and does He actually rule over your life? "We have turned everyone to his own way" (Is. 53:6) describes the course which we all follow by nature. Before conversion every soul lives to please self. Of old it was written - "Every man did that which was right in his own eyes" - and why? - "In those days there was no King in Israel" (Judges 21:25). Ah! that is the point we desire to make clear. Until Christ becomes your King (11im. 1:17; Rev. 15:3), until you bow to His sceptre, until His Will becomes the rule of your life, self dominates - and thus Christ is disowned.

When the Holy Spirit begins His work of grace in a soul, He first convicts of sin. He shows the real and awful nature of sin. He makes

each one realise that it is a species of insurrection, a defying of God's authority, a setting of your Will against His. He shows that in going your "own way" (Is. 53:6), in pleasing yourself, you have been fighting against God. As the eyes are opened to see what a lifelong rebel you have been, how indifferent to God's honour, how unconcerned about His Will – you are filled with anguish and horror and made to marvel that the thrice Holy One has not long since cast you into Hell. Reader, have you ever gone through this experience? If not, there is very grave reason to fear that you are yet spiritually dead!

Conversion, true conversion, saving conversion, is a turning from sin to God in Christ. It is a throwing down of the weapons of warfare against Him, a ceasing to despise and ignore His authority. New Testament conversion is described thus: "Ye turned to God from idols to serve [to be in subjection to, to obey] the living and true God" (1Thess. 1:9). An "idol" is any object to which we give what is due alone unto God - the supreme place in our affections, the moulding influence of our hearts, the dominating power of our lives. Conversion is a complete about face, the heart and will repudiating sin, self, and the world. Genuine conversion is always evidenced by "Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do?" (Acts 9:6); it is an unreserved surrendering of ourselves to His Holy Will. Have you yielded yourself to Him (Rom. 6:13)?

There are many people who would like to be saved from Hell, but who do not want to be saved from self-will, from having their own way, from a life of (some form of) worldliness; but God will not save them on their terms. To be saved, we must submit to His terms: "Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the Lord [having revolted from Him in Adam], and He will have mercy upon him" (ls. 55:7). Said Christ, "Whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath [all that is opposed to Me], he cannot be My disciple" (Luke 14:33). Men must be turned [by God] "from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God," before they can "receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified" (Acts 26:18).


"As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in Him" (Col. 2:6). That is an exhortation to Christians, and its force is continue as you began; but how had they "begun"? By receiving "Christ Jesus the Lord," by surrendering to Him, by subjecting themselves to His Will, by ceasing to please themselves. His authority was now owned. His Commands now became their rule of life. His love constrained them to a glad and unreserved obedience. They "gave their own selves to the Lord" (2 Cor. 8:5). Have you done this? Have you? Do the details of your life evidence it? Can those with whom you come into contact see that you are no more living to please self (2 Cor. 5:15)?

Oh my reader, make no mistake upon this point: a conversion which the Holy Spirit produces is a very radical thing. It is a miracle of grace. It is the enthroning of Christ in the life - and such conversions are rare indeed. Multitudes of people have just sufficient "religion" to make them miserable. They refuse to forsake every known sin and there is no true peace for any soul until he does. They have never "received Christ Jesus the Lord" (Col. 2:6). Had they done so, "the joy of the LORD" would be their strength (Neh. 8:10); but the language of their hearts and lives (not their "lips") is - "we will not have this man to reign over us" (Luke 19:14). Is that your case?

The great miracle of grace consists in changing a lawless rebel into a loving and loyal subject. It is a "renewing" of the heart, so that the favoured subject of it has come to loathe what he loved - and the things he once found irksome are now winsome (2 Cor. 5:17). He delights "in the law of God after the inward man" (Rom. 7:22). He discovers that Christ's "commandments are not grievous" (1 John 5:3), and that "in keeping of them there is great reward" (Ps. 19:11). Is this your experience? It would be if you received Christ Jesus THE LORD!

But to receive Christ Jesus the Lord is altogether beyond unaided human power. That is the last thing which the unrenewed heart wants to do. There must be a supernatural change of heart before there is even the desire for Christ to occupy its throne - and that change none but God can work (1 Cor. 12:3). Therefore "Seek ye the LORD while He may be found" (ls. 55:6). Search for Him with all your heart (Jer. 29:13). You may have been a professing Christian for years past and you may have been quite sincere in your profession – but, if God has condescended to use this article to show you that you have never really and truly "received Christ Jesus the Lord," if now in your own soul and conscience you realise that SELF has ruled you hitherto, will you not now get down on your knees and confess to God. Confess to Him your self-will, your rebellion against Him - and beg Him to so work in you that, without further delay, you may be enabled to yield yourself completely to His Will and become His subject, His servant, His loving slave, in deed and in truth?

### AN ANTIDOTE FOR DISCOURAGEMENT "Consider Him" Hebrews 12:3

It is the plan of Satan so to attack and harass the people of God that they will become "wearied and faint" in their minds. The word wearied means 'exhausted,' being so despondent and discouraged as to have one's spirit broken. The consequence of that is to be "faint" of mind. *Faint* literally means 'to lose out,' or to 'relax.' It signifies an abandonment of one's stand for the Gospel and the Word of God. Surely this is Satan's aim in these days. He is determined to break the spirit of the faithful remnant and cause them to relax in their stand against the enemies of truth.

How can such a tragedy be prevented? The words of our text signify the only preventative: Consider Him. The word consider means 'to compute by comparing things in their due proportion.' In the context here, Paul is urging believers to form an accurate estimate of Christ's suffering and compare their own with it. The Apostle speaks of Christ enduring "such contradiction of sinner against Himself." The idea is that Christ's sufferings were unprecedented, unparalleled and unsurpassed. In effect. therefore, Paul is drawing our attention to the cross and Christ's agony there. Ultimately, he is directing us to the love of Christ for His church. When we "behold, and see" (Lam. 1:12) that there is no sorrow like Christ's, we are reminded of Christ's mighty love for the elect. It is an unconditional, sacrificial and immutable love. Such love calls for faithfulness and steadfastness for Christ. May each of us catch a fresh glimpse of Christ's love in His work on the cross and be strengthened as we strive against sin.

#### Central Bank Digital Currency/Digital ID

The UK Government and the Treasury are planning, in the near future, to launch a Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC). So what actually is CBDC?

CBDC is different from cash - it is not just an alternative way of paying bills! It is more akin to Government-issued tokens, that can only be spent according to their conditions. It gives unprecedented level of control over each one of us - not simply as when buying or selling, but now involving trackable devices which will be required for all transactions.

Every financial transaction will be tracked, traced and controlled. Purchasing or selling so-called unapproved items will be banned. The elimination of cash is the eventual aim - and its introduction will be a hammer-blow to all respectable citizens (pro-life, pro-family etc.).

Governments and Central Banks are relishing the prospect – we must do all in our power to resist the move to a cash-less society. Say NO now by writing to the Chancellor of the Exchequer and expressing your concerns.



At the same time, the UK is heading towards a national ID system – aimed at easing the public's interaction with Government services.

However, while promising efficiency and seamless identity verification, this system – as with all centralised ID systems – also allows for excessive surveillance and tracking, posing a threat to personal privacy and freedom.

The One Login System enables individuals to access Government services – and plans to integrate Companies House, Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) and the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) and is set to debut in the coming months.

By Spring 2024, HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) will start directing new users to the One Login System and the end of March, 2025 is targeted as the time-frame for integration of the 'vast bulk' of Government services.

We must pray that the Will of the Lord will be known in these matters and that decent law-abiding citizens will not be subject to undue harassment and interference as they live their lives to the glory of God.

### "WOKE" Disney

Disney lost nearly 900 million dollars at the Box Office in 2022, according to a new industry analysis – and is now facing an unprecedented financial crisis.

Disney's financial woes come as the Company increasingly embraces transgenderism, critical race theory and other forms of WOKE politics in its entertainment aimed at children.

#### Persecution of Christians -

'Notes and Comments', The Free Presbyterian Magazine, July, 2023

A report prepared for the UK Foreign Secretary by the Bishop of Truro states - 'Across the globe, in the Middle East, Asia and Africa, Christians are being bullied, arrested, gaoled, expelled and executed. Christianity is by most calculations the most persecuted religion of modern times.' To give an idea of the numbers involved, the charity, Open Doors, shared the following statistics for 2022, which they say are a conservative estimate:

- 5,600 Christians killed for their faith.
- 2,100 churches attacked or closed (mostly in China).
- 124,000 Christians forcibly displaced from their homes because of their faith, almost 15,000 of whom became refugees.
- 360 million Christians suffering high levels of persecution for their faith in over 50 countries.

North Korea has long been the world's most notorious country for persecuting Christians and, according to all the Agencies which monitor persecution, it remains in the number one spot. This dictatorship is a brutally hostile place for Christians to live. If discovered by the Authorities, believers are either sent to labour camps as political prisoners or killed on the spot. Even owning a Bible is a serious crime and will be severely punished.

Nigeria has a Christian majority in the south of the country, but Islamic militants from the north conduct raids on the Christian community; the Nigerian Government denies it is religious persecution and so the raids continue with impunity. In sub-Saharan Africa, Islamist extremism has spread well beyond Nigeria. Open Doors fears that Nigeria will soon trigger 'a vast humanitarian catastrophe' across the continent.

Christians face most physical violence in Nigeria, Pakistan and India.

During the Covid pandemic there was a great deal of discrimination, especially in Pakistan and India, with Christians often being refused help and food aid.

Christians are persecuted for a number of reasons, which include: Islamic oppression (8 of the top 10 persecuting countries), dictatorial paranoia (Syria and Uzbekistan), Communist and post-Communist oppression (North Korea and China) and religious nationalism (India and Myanmar).

In the United Kingdom, we should be thankful to have laws which protect our religious freedoms. However, there is an atmosphere, certainly in the workplace, where one must be very careful of expressing a Christian opinion, especially when it is opposed to the current wholesale acceptance of abortion, same-sex marriage, gender fluidity etc. There are many examples of discrimination and heavy-handed officialdom, but they cannot be compared with the persecution experienced in other countries. We must not permit our current religious freedoms to be eroded.

In our progressively 'liberal' society, some honourable vocations such as medicine, teaching and working as a Registrar are becoming intolerable for some to continue in without violating Christian principles. There is a steady drip, drip of subtle, and not so subtle, erosion of freedom of speech with the expression of some opinions being described as hate crimes. This may yet lead to the censoring of the preaching of the Gospel and must be resisted at all costs. "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong" (1 Cor. 16:13).

As for those who are persecuted and discriminated against for taking the name of Christ on their lips, we should prayerfully "remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body" (Heb. 13:3).


